Our staff consists of 12 full-time and one part-time employee. Our Healthy Start home visiting services are contracted through the Florida Department of Health in Collier, Hendry and Glades County and Lee Health in Lee County.



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

The goal of the Coordinated Intake and Referral CI&R process is to provide the best services for families by prioritizing their needs and preferences and minimizing duplication of services. This process ensures the effective use of local resources and collectively tracks what happens to each family. Home visiting programs offered by Connect include Healthy Start, Healthy Families and Nurse-Family Partnership.

PRENATAL INTAKES

Prenatal Risk Screens are completed at the Prenatal Medical Care Provider's office.

Screens are scored to assess risk and identify those pregnant women most vulnerable to experiencing adverse health outcomes. Based on her level of risk, she may be referred to one of the home visiting programs served by Connect.

INFANT INITIAL INTAKES

An Infant Screen is conducted at the delivery hospital to determine the level of risk for the baby. Infants who score at-risk are contacted by our Connect team and offered home visiting services.





Healthy Start is a free home visiting program that provides education and care coordination to pregnant women and families of children under the age of three. The goal of the program is to lower risk factors associated with preterm birth, low birth weight, infant mortality and poor developmental outcomes

Nurse-Family Partnership empowers firsttime moms to transform their lives and create better futures for themselves and their babies. In Nurse-Family Partnership, a Registered Nurse provides regular home visits, starting early in pregnancy, and continuing through the child's second birthday.





SWFL DATA- FL HEALTH CHARTS






2017-2019 Fetal Death Per 1,000




2017-2019 Sudden Unexplained Infant Death

My name is Fatima and I am the mother of Zoe . I am from Honduras, and when I came to Immokalee, I was not familiar with the community and resources available for my family and me. I've learned a lot from the Healthy Start Program. The care coordinator who visits my child and me. It's not only somebody I can talk to and confide in, but somebody that has helped me and guided me to be a better mom. My Healthy Start home visitor assisted me in connecting with local resources and becoming more familiar with the community and the different agencies in the area where I live. The educational tools provided by the educator and the program helped me to strengthen my parenting skills. I have learned how to understand my child better, to interpret her signals and signs, and how to bond with my child more effectively. My home visitor has taught me so much about parenting, the importance of spacing pregnancies as well as to plan and set goals for a better future. My daughter, Zoe, is now successfully walking. She is enrolled in WIC and has Medicaid. She is almost 16 months old and has grown to be a healthy and happy child with the help and support of the program. I am now a mom with more knowledge and thankful to Healthy Start for the support and education they provide us.





Jennifer was 15 and in the 10th grade when she found out she was pregnant. She agreed to services during her second trimester and based on her scoring and level of risk, it was determined that the Nurse Family Partnership Program was the best fit for her. Jennifer completed the 2 1/2 year program while also obtaining her high school diploma. After working with our Nurse, Jennifer decided she wants to continue her education in the nursing field so she can also help others.





I heard of Help Me Grow through 2-1-1. My concern at the time of my call was my son's behavior. The care coordinator called me for an interview. My son was referred to a mental health clinic for an evaluation by professionals. The mental health therapist spoke with me through an interpreter and shared the treatment plan. I understand this therapy will help my son focus more, improve his behavior and he will get help managing his anger. I would recommend Help Me Grow because they can help you with your health issues with your children.
